## Dear Sir/Madam

The company is writing, pursuant to the obligations of section 51 of the *Occupational Health* and *Safety Act*, to report a critical injury which occurred at the workplace, as discussed with you. We wish to report the following information:

- 1. The individual is a student at McMaster University.
- 2. Several McMaster University Athletics and Recreation members were using the David Braley Athletic Centre track at the time of the incident. There appears to have been a disagreement between one member and a group of members regarding the track usage policy. Shortly thereafter, a serious collision occurred. The result of the collision was a broken shoulder. The McMaster University Emergency First Response Team and McMaster University Security Services were contacted immediately. The injured individual did seek medical treatment. A Hamilton Police Services investigation is currently underway regarding this incident.
- 3. The accident occurred on December 10, 2011 at 11:53 a.m.
- 4. The person involved in the accident was Vlad Bukshadynov.
- 5. Witnesses to the accident were as follows:

George Kerr – McMaster University Athletics and Recreation Member

6. Steps taken to prevent a recurrence are:



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The McMaster University Athletics and Recreation Track Policy is available both online and in the area of the track. Follow up communication will take place regarding this policy to all parties involved in the incident.

Based on the results of the Hamilton Police Services investigation McMaster University may take further actions as necessary.

I understand that the Ministry's decision relating to your request was appealed to the Information and Privacy Commissioner (IPC). The purpose of this letter is to advise that the Ministry has reconsidered its original decision to exempt names and the titles of the two individuals from page one of the McMaster University letter to the Ministry dated December 15, 2011, which is the subject of this appeal. The Ministry has determined that the letter should be released in its entirety; a copy of which is enclosed.

The Ministry has also decided to release the phone number of an individual that was removed from the Event Information Form; a copy of which is also enclosed.

The IPC has been advised of our revised decision and will be provided with a copy of this letter as well as a copy of the two records.
